Submission Is NOT a Dirty Word! Ephesians 5:15-33 • Brett & Kellie Hurst

A swe continue our summer sermon series, *Wrestling With Scripture*, we move to the latter portion of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. In chapter 5 of this beautiful love letter from God's heart, Paul is encouraging us to live lives that reflect the grace and love of our Creator. Just as children often imitate their parents, we as Christians are drawn to imitate Christ. Jesus sacrificed for us in the ultimate expression of submission to the Father. Our love for one another should be of the same kind—a love of sacrifice and yielding to greater service to the Lord and to one another. Because of God's commitment to mold us into faithful servants, this kind of godly character will grow naturally in marriage, family, church, community, and beyond.

- 1. In the first three chapters of Ephesians, Paul presents several beautiful "indicatives," glorious statements of facts, that describe the remarkable position that believers experience in Christ. Can you briefly list some of those unchanging indicatives mentioned in chapters 1-3?
- 2. Ephesians 5 is all about walking in love and then breaking things down into specifics. Read Eph. 5:15-17. What things does God want us to know in these verses?
- 3. In Eph. 5:18, God makes it clear that He does not want us under control of outside influences; rather, He wants us to "be filled with the Spirit." In what practical ways does God guide us to walk in the Spirit? (See Eph. 5:19-21.)
- 4. Read John 15:13. What is Jesus' definition of the greatest love possible? How does this connect with Paul's instruction to husbands to "love their wives as Christ loved the church"? Meanwhile, what are tangible ways that men and women can serve each other in everyday daily living?
- 5. Genesis 2:18 states that God made Adam a helper "suitable" for him. How necessary do you believe it was it for Adam to interact with another kind of human being who was equal to him in every way? How important was it for the woman to be different from Adam?
- 6. Give examples of ways that your own parents were different from one another. How did their differing strengths influence who you have become today?
- 7. Read Galatians 3:28. Then read Ephesians 5:22-33. If men and women are clearly equal to one another in Christ, why do you think God assigned different roles to each in marriage?
