## SERMON NOTES

This is the fifth of six in a series on Joseph's circuitous journey of life and faith and how that helps us ponder our own journeys. Joseph has confronted several crucibles by this point. Now, when no one else can, he interprets two dreams for Pharaoh that say there will be seven years of plenty followed by seven years of drought. Pha-

# THIS IS US

The Story of Joseph's Family...and Ours From Revenge to Reconciliation Genesis 45:1-8, 50:15-21 (NRSV)

raoh makes Joseph the Secretary of Agriculture—second-in-command in all of Egypt. Joseph proceeds to stockpile 20% of the grain harvest in the good years, making Egypt the granary for the world in the bad years. Joseph's brothers are among those who come to seek food. The crossroad before Joseph now is: How will he use his power? For good or for evil? For revenge or for reconciliation?

- 1. If you are able, read Genesis 41-44. This is the long, convoluted story of how Joseph identifies his brothers, toys with them for a while, tests their character, and finally gets tired of revenge. What strikes you from these chapters? How do you identify with Joseph's first instinct to get even? Is there a time when you went down that path? What was the result?
- 2. Read Genesis 45:1-8. Describe how Joseph finally tells his brothers who he is (verses 1-4). How does Joseph emote? How do the brothers react/emote?
- 3. In verse 4, Joseph asks them to come closer, then names their sin: "whom you sold into slavery." What do both actions help produce? What can't we see from far away? Does it ever help to ignore or deny the truth?
- 4. Read verses 5-8. Once Joseph has "called a spade a spade," he offers an alternative vision of reality that must have been hard for his brothers (and himself, at first) to fathom. What does Joseph say has really been going on all along? Or, where is God in all this?
- 5. What is your personal reaction to that theological interpretation of things? Have you experienced anything similar to this in your life as you looked back on it? Is hindsight 20/20?
  - 5b. Read Romans 8:28, 31-39. Paul, who himself experienced the highs and lows of following and serving God, speaks from experience about God's providence and overarching sovereignty. Do Paul's words here help or further complicate this discussion? How?
- 6. Finally, read Genesis 50:15-21. Jacob has died and Joseph's brothers again are worried Joseph might seek revenge because he still is the one with the power. Why don't repentances and reconciliations seem to stay settled? Don't fear and revenge have a tendency of reappearing later on in our stories with other people? How did Joseph squelch this concern? What argument did he use with himself and with them? How might we assure others forgiveness and reconciliation are true and lasting? Sometimes things only stay settled (and relationships stay positive and strong) with persistence and reassurance.
