PARENTING TIPS

Recently, we have been having some violent play at Yellow School. We have heard children talk about zombies and cutting off heads and "going after bad guys" in other gory ways. Although it is normal for children to engage in play that demonstrates their developing strength and abilities, we must be diligent in overseeing the programs they are watching and the games they are playing on computers, iPhones and iPads and the like. Many of these things which are easily accessible to children are completely inappropriate for them to be watching. The ugliness of the characters and the pulsing music that accompanies them are usually overstimulating and beyond the scope of young children's ability to understand. They only see the violence and have not yet had enough life experience to turn those media models into age appropriate play with their peers.

Even the news and some commercials are inappropriate for our younger children. Try to limit your own viewing to times when the younger children are not around.

On another note, one of the keynote speakers for an upcoming teacher's conference is an educator named Amanda Morgan. Amanda writes a blog and publishes articles on her website, **notjustcute.com**.
