#### PARENT SURVEY REPORT

Thank you to all who took the time to complete and return the Parent Survey. It is very helpful to have your suggestions and very affirming to read your many wonderful comments. All but one of you said you would recommend the school to others. The one who would not, said it was because we needed to improve the curriculum. That response was from the parent of a threeyear-old who felt it was important for the children learn to write letters and numbers. The 3-year-old curriculum incorporates lots of numeral and letter recognition, phonemic awareness, counting, lots of opportunities to write and much more, but the majority of 3 year olds are still learning to hold a pencil properly and to make basic shapes which are a necessary precursor to writing letters. We encourage children to write as they are able, but expecting 3s to write the alphabet and numerals 1-9 is not a developmentally appropriate goal.

## YOUR COMMENTS:

#### School days and hours

Of those who commented about the school hours, some wanted all full days and

an equal number loved having the flexibility of choosing long and short days. Two people expressed a desire for an earlier start time, but did not specify how early. We understand that our schedule is difficult for parents who work outside the home, but we try to utilize the 5 classrooms in the school in the most efficient and cost effective way that will provide flexibility for our families and the best learning environment we can provide for the children.

Our days are consecutive, based on research that shows children retain information better with immediate reinforcement.

One mom wanted to be able to choose days as they do at Little School. Little School is designed on a Mother's Day Out model where each day can stand alone. The Yellow School follows a school model in which the curriculum is designed for each class (rather than a single day) which meets on specific consecutive days with the same children each day.

#### <u>Curriculum</u>

For the most part, you were happy with the curriculum. Many of you said your children are recognizing sight words, sounding out letters and words, and talking excitedly at home about the many things they have learned. One mom said her older children who had attended Yellow School have excelled in reading, writing and math in elementary school. On the other hand, one mom said she had heard that some parents felt their children were not well-prepared. It is true that in past years we did not emphasize sight words and we let writing develop more naturally. Since public kindergartens are asking more of children, in the last two years we have added Handwriting Without Tears to our curriculum and are giving the children more

opportunities for writing and working on sight words. As you look at the "What's Happenings" posted on our website, you can see what we are doing and the goals and objectives we are working towards. Given developmental differences, not all children will attain these goals at the same time, but we are working hard to align our curriculum with that of the public schools in our area.

#### Communication

Many of you would like weekly communication specifically about your child. We are working on ways to facilitate this. We have been considering some apps that might work for us and hope that we'll be able to institute some changes for next year. Rest assured, however, if there are concerns about your child, we are in touch with you. We hope that any time any of you have questions or concerns, you will contact us.

#### New children introduction to school

Most of you really liked the home visits, but a couple of you asked about bringing your child to see the school and meeting the teachers. We have found from past experience that a dedicated day to see the rooms does not work well, but we welcome you to bring your child to school at any time to see the classroom. You can do this any time from now to the end of this school year; on picnic day; on the day of Parent Orientation; or any day this summer. There is usually someone here each day, although you might want to call first, just in case.

#### Some of the things you particularly like...

Loved the warm, welcoming environment with small classes.

Children learn skills that will help them with their peers later in life. Ability to give individualized instruction and attention to the children.

Plenty of opportunity for movement during the day.

The nurturing atmosphere and all the opportunities for creativity

The hands-on experiences and field trips!

Teaching children simple responsibility through classroom jobs.

Fostering independence
